South West Surrey Domestic Abuse Service is looking for a Children and Youth Worker to join our outreach team to support children (5+) and young people (up to 21 years) who have experienced and/or witnessed domestic abuse. You will provide and coordinate services that will enable them to make sense of their experiences, come to terms with their situation and develop and grow in self-esteem and confidence.

Hours are 28 each week and the pattern of hours and days is open to negotiation. This is a permanent contract.

Experience of working with children/or within domestic abuse is desirable but not essential. Empathy for the needs of children and wanting to make a positive difference to their lives is more important. Full training will be given.

The role includes:

- Assessing the needs of children/young people
- Working with children/young people therapeutically, both one to one and in groups within an external safe space
- Supporting children/young people to recognise the impact of abusive behaviours on their mental and emotional health

You will be working as part of our team of over 20 staff based on the edge of Guildford. You must have a driving licence and have access to a vehicle as some travel across Surrey, including in rural areas, may be required. A strong commitment to equal opportunities is essential.

*This role is open to female applicants only. In light of the nature of the work, the candidate's gender is considered to be an occupational requirement in accordance with Schedule 9 (part 1) of the Equality Act 2010.
